

Františka Plamínková's legacy in the 21st century

On the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Senator Františka Plamínková, the President of the Senate of the Parliament of the Czech Republic and the Office of the Government of the Czech Republic are organising a conference entitled Plamínková. And What's Next?

She wanted equal rights for all and guaranteed her legacy with her own life. Senator Františka Plamínková saw politics as a way to promote human rights and advocate for a better position for women in society. She said, "Men take politics as their goal, whereas for women it is a means to improve their lives." She was instrumental in the abolition of celibacy for female teachers, and also advocated for the introduction of women's suffrage. Her political career and public engagement were broken by the Second World War, she was executed on June 30, 1942 at the firing range in Kobylisy in Prague.

The aim of the conference is to commemorate the extraordinary legacy of Františka Plamínková, an important Czech feminist, journalist and politician, and to reflect together on the current position of women in our society.
